 - 2020-2021 RISE (3-5) data showed 56% Mt. Loafer students as proficient. District average was 45%. 2020-22021 Acadience Math data showed 52% of Mt. Loafer students as proficient. District average was 48%.
 - b. Review current School Trustland Math Goal
 - 2022-2023 math goal is that by the end of the year, the percentage of students at or above proficiency will increase by 1%. Measured by RISE (3-5 grades) and Acadience (K-5) assessment data.
