Sarah met with Alicia Rudd on red line items and necessary changes to SIP. Reading goal language changed from "89%-91% improvement" to "a 2% increase".

Change from "DIBELS" to "Acadience". Action plans for Reading goal were simplified as possible. We are using both MyOn and Imagine Learning to support instruction.

Elementary Math goal will be changed to meet our needs as to adjust for learning curve in changing from SAGE platform to the RISE platform. Sarah will work on the wording for this goal to propose for next month. Sarah is checking into a Reflex Math license. We will vote on whether or not to purchase in February.

Arts Goal-No changes are necessary as per district goals.
